



Knabs Ridge Wind Farm Community Fund Annual Report Spring 2020

This report details the grants made from the Knabs Ridge Wind Farm Fund during the period 1st April 2019 to 20th February 2020. The fund was set up by Innogy Renewables UK Ltd and is administered by Two Ridings Community Foundation to provide grants that enhance life for residents in the communities around the wind farm.

Grants are available of up to £2500 for a wide variety of purposes supporting charitable activities that:-

- Enhance quality of life for local residents
- Contribute to vibrant, healthy, successful and sustainable communities
- Promote community spirit and encourage community activity

Micro grants of up to £500 are available throughout the year (subject to available funding). Larger grants of up to £2500 are made following decisions by a panel made up of local residents.

This year, seven micro grants were awarded, totalling £3235. Larger grants totalled £17,310, eight in all. In total, 15 groups were funded with a total of £20,545.



With the support of the Knabs Ridge Wind Farm Fund many communities provide amenities for all local residents. Blubberhouses cricket club (*pictured, left*), already welcoming people from a range of ages, were awarded £2056 to improve their play area. Families could watch the play at cricket matches while smaller children can still have fun. Everyone is welcome to use the play area.

When a community gets together to enjoy activities and time together, volunteers often shoulder the responsibility of organising and carrying out the events. Darley Memorial Hall applied for £1000 for (among other items) kitchen equipment. They intended that it would be used to replace old, lost and out-of-date equipment, and would make catering for events

much easier for the volunteers. In October, the Memorial Hall reported that one of their volunteers who helps in the kitchen was enjoying using the new equipment. She was even looking forward to their New Year's Eve event which would include a three course meal for 160 people! The volunteers say that they are able to spend more time socialising at events now their work is easier.



Being part of a community often involves supporting everyone to take part in the activities that they enjoy. Summerbridge and Dacre Silver Band used a micro grant of £500 to purchase a baritone horn so that members and potential members would not personally have to make the large outlay.

Darley Playing Field Association were able to make their community shop, post office and café more welcoming and comfortable to all with the installation of a new ventilation system. Previous summers and winters had not been pleasant!



Trips out for people who might otherwise struggle to leave their homes can help older or less mobile residents be part of their communities. Both the Hampsthwaite WI and Hampsthwaite Wednesday Club ran trips with a micro grant.

Alongside smaller trips, large events can also bring the community together. Hampsthwaite Feast (*pictured left*) now has a new PA system for its events and to loan out to other community organisations. Fortunately, there were no lost children this year but they say that the PA system is still very valuable.
