RWE – A global leader in offshore wind

The demand for electricity from renewable energies is rising dramatically. RWE fulfils this growing demand globally by planning, constructing and operating offshore wind farms.

Already the world's second largest offshore company, our unparalleled track record of more than 20 years in offshore wind has resulted in 19 operational offshore wind farms, with a goal to triple our global offshore wind capacity in the next decade. This is in line with our Growing Green investment and growth strategy, which will see RWE investing billions of euros globally.

RWE in the UK & Ireland

The UK and Ireland are among RWE's most strategically important markets.

RWE is a leading partner in the delivery of both the UK and Irish Government's Net Zero ambitions and energy security. Including the recent acquisition of three Norfolk offshore wind projects, RWE has ten offshore wind projects in development, representing a combined potential installed capacity of over 10.5 GW, with RWE's pro rata share amounting to almost 7.5 GW. RWE is constructing the 1.4 GW Sofia offshore wind project in the North Sea and operates ten offshore wind farms across the UK and Ireland.

Leading the way towards competitive floating wind

RWE's experience in offshore wind, combined with its in-house engineering expertise and global approach, positions the business well to become a leader in

floating wind. RWE is actively participating in two high-profile demonstration projects in Norway and Spain to gain early floating wind experience. RWE has already secured a commercial-scale floating wind lease off the Californian coast, pre-qualified to bid for floating wind auctions in France, and is preparing for auctions in Norway and the Celtic Sea in the UK.

Floating Wind presents an important economic opportunity, driving investment, sector growth, and new, skilled jobs.

Supporting Local Communities


In 2023, offshore wind farms operated by RWE contributed over £1.6 million to local community funds and secured even more in match funding. Our community funds are flexible and designed to support what is most important to communities, with funding decisions made by panels of local people.

Our community funds enable groups and organisations to tackle key issues in UK communities. Among other initiatives, our funds have helped to reduce carbon emissions and running costs in community buildings; enabled groups to reduce food waste and fight hunger deprivation; facilitated cheap, green transport via bicycle schemes; created staff training resources that deal with domestic abuse; and kept young people fit and active with local sports projects and facilities.
